PREPARATION FOR PERFORMANCE SHOPPING LIST

All dancers will need the following items for the upcoming photo shoot and dress rehearsals (Tuesday, May 17 or Wednesday, May 18) and performance (Saturday, May 21). We encourage you to shop ahead of time!

Pink ballet slippers

- Shoes should be leather or canvas – NO bedroom slippers, please
- Please write your child's name on the INSIDE of her ballet slippers where the foot goes (NOT on outside or the sole of the of the shoe)

Pink tights (2 pairs)

- All tights should have no more than 12 percent spandex or lycra (they are too shiny and reflect the light on stage). Also, please no tights with shaded thighs
- All tights should cover the feet (no footless tights)
- All tights should be seamless

VARIOUS ITEMS

The following items can be purchased at Walgreens, Osco, Target, Wal-Mart, etc.

- Hair net (to match the color of the dancer's hair)**
- Hair gel (Dep is recommended)**
- Bobby pins (to match the color of the dancer's hair)**
- Safety pins**
- Age-appropriate makeup, including lipstick and blush at a *minimum* for all dancers**

BALLET BUN 101

For photos, dress rehearsal and performance, the ballerina's hair should be worn in a bun with the bangs and wispy hairs slicked back. For performance in particular, it is important the hair looks smooth and neat, so use lots of gel and hairspray to prevent wisps of hair from getting loose.

Your instructor will give you a quick demonstration on how to style a ballet bun, but in the meantime, here are a few tips to help if styling a bun is new to you:

- Work with the hair while it is wet.
- Generously apply hair gel to the hair from the roots on down to the ends.
- Brush hair into a ponytail in the middle of the back of the dancer's head; secure with a ponytail holder.
- Twist the hair in the ponytail up and around the ponytail holder into the shape of a bun. Use a few bobby pins at this point to help secure the bun, especially if your dancer has long, thick hair.
- Cover the resulting bun with a hair net. You may want to work with the hair net first to double it over or even triple or quadruple it over so it fits securely over the bun.
- Secure the hair net and bun with bobby pins. We recommend making "Xs" with the pins at the top, bottom and right and left sides to start out. Use additional pins as needed.

Of course, some dancers' hair may not work well in a ballet bun. In that case, we request that the dancer have her hair styled in a manner such that it looks neat and will not move into her eyes and face as she dances. It is very distracting to the dancer and the audience will notice a dancer fussing with her hair rather than dancing. If your dancer's hair isn't long enough for a bun, an alternative would be to smooth the hair back into a low ponytail or pull the sides back into a half-ponytail.

Makeup for Photos

For photos, dancers may wear a small amount of makeup at the parent's discretion. After the dancers are photographed, they will have a short amount of downtime prior to their dress rehearsal time slot. We suggest during this time, you prepare your dancer with a little bit more makeup for the stage as noted below.

Makeup for Dress Rehearsal and Recital Day

Stage lights are very bright and can make the dancers look pale, so all Pre-Ballet dancers should wear makeup for dress rehearsal and on recital day. We recommend lipstick and blush at a minimum (reds or a berry tone works best), and possibly light eye makeup in neutral colors (brown in the crease, pink, ivory or coral as a highlight). Apply generously!

WHEN: Friday, May 6 - Friday, May 20 at noon

TICKET PRICES: \$7 in advance, \$9 at the door. No ticket limit and no rush to purchase tickets. All seats are general admission!

REGISTER UNDER: Class code 43992
"Dance Recital: 'A Safari Ballet' May 21, 2022 – Pre-Ballet"

HOW TO BOOK YOUR TICKET ORDER:

- You may register for your tickets online via MPPD's WebStore or by calling 847.640.1000 and asking for front desk assistance.
- You can purchase as many seats as needed under one person's name.
- If you register for tickets through WebStore:
 - In the "search" field, enter class code 43992
 - Then click on the headline that comes up "Dance Recital: 'A Safari Ballet' May 21, 2022 – Pre-Ballet"
 - Then you can click on your name to add one ticket. Continue to click on your name to add as many seats as you need for your group. For example, if I needed six tickets, I would choose to register under "Amy Hubert" and add one seat under my name to my cart six times.
- If you register by phone, be prepared with class code 43992 and the front desk staff will be able to assist you.
- If you need more tickets after placing your initial order, you can just log back in / call back and purchase more seats.

- When you come to Forest View on the performance day, you do not need to bring anything with you. You can gather your group in the lobby and come to the entrance to the auditorium together. Our volunteer ushers will have a list with the name of the person that purchased the tickets as well as the number of tickets/seats purchased.

Other details:

- Children dancing in the performance and parents who volunteer backstage to stay with the dancers do NOT need to purchase tickets
- All patrons over the age of 2 must have a ticket due to fire codes
- On Saturday, May 21, all remaining tickets will be available for \$9 at Forest View starting 30 minutes prior to curtain

If you have any issues or questions, please contact Amy Hubert at ahubert@mppd.org. We really appreciate all parent volunteer help! At dress rehearsal, when your dancer’s group is called, please come to the stage. We will show you and the girls the space they will be in before they dance and how we will line them up before they perform and move to the stage. Parents who volunteer backstage do NOT need to purchase a ticket and will be able to come watch the class dance backstage from the wings!

Tuesday, May 17 & Wednesday, May 18

Photo Shoot at Forest View Educational Center

- Please attend your child’s shoot even if you are not purchasing pictures so all dancers can be in the group photo.
- For the photo shoot, all dancers need to wear their costume, any accessories, footed pink tights and ballet slippers. Dancers and parents do NOT need to bring any paperwork or form of payment to the photo shoot. About three weeks after the photo shoot, you can log into the JD Event photography Web page (<https://www.jdeventphotography.com/>). From there, click on the Mt. Prospect School of Classical Ballet logo, enter your primary email address and you will have access to your family’s photo gallery. You will be able to order photos directly via the Web page.
- We respectfully ask that parents remain in the waiting area while instructors coordinate the shoot with JD Event Photography, a photographer that specializes in dance photos. We will work to make sure the students look their best from head to toe when they are photographed.
- For photos, dancers should wear their hair in a bun with a hair net. Dancers may wear a small amount of makeup at the parent’s discretion. You may wish to apply more makeup after the photo for dress rehearsal (see below).

Dress Rehearsal - Immediately following photos at Forest View

- Parents are welcome to remain in the theater during dress rehearsal. This is a good time to shoot candid pictures and videos.
- During dress rehearsal, instructors will show dancers and parent volunteers where they will be waiting backstage, where they will stand on stage and how to enter and exit. The dancers will run through the dance with the music a few times and the entire class will be dismissed together.
- Stage lights are very bright and can make the dancers look pale, so we encourage all dancers to wear makeup for dress rehearsal and on recital day. We recommend lipstick and blush at a minimum (berry tones works best), and possibly light eye makeup in neutral colors (brown in the crease, pink, ivory or coral as a highlight). Apply generously!

Please remember that dress rehearsal is extremely critical to the young dancer’s comfort level on performance day – we cannot stress this enough. If you have an unavoidable conflict, please inform your instructor as soon as possible.

Important Times for Pre-Ballet Recital

Parent volunteers should arrive by 9:40 a.m.

All dancers should arrive at 10 a.m. and the performance begins at 10:30 a.m.

When you arrive at the Forest View auditorium entrance, you will see signs directing you to the dancer checkpoint. Dancers will be escorted to the backstage area where the class's parent volunteers and dance leaders will be waiting for the children. While the dancers are waiting, we will have crayons and some coloring pages to keep them busy until it is their turn to dance.

We kindly ask that if your dancer is comfortable separating at the checkpoint that you do so to minimize the number of people backstage. However, if your child is having difficulty, one family member may go backstage with her to help settle her in.

Things to Bring to the Theater with Your Dancer

On recital day, in addition to your child's costume and ballet slippers, we recommend packing:

- A beach towel to sit on to give her a sense of personal space
- A book or other non-messy activity (we will bring crayons and coloring pages)
- A bottle of water (preferably non-spill)
- A Ziplock bag with your child's name on it with her lipstick inside in case she needs a touch up before going on stage
- Bobby pins (to match the color of the dancer's hair)
- Safety pins

Post-Performance Dancer Dismissal

At the end of each show, all of the dancers will return to the stage for a photo opportunity with the entire cast. We will dismiss the dancers from the stage by class. We would like to ask that each family send ONE family member to the front of the theater to pick up their dancer. You will then be able to return with your dancer to the staging room to gather up her items before leaving the theater.

We thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as you wait for your turn to greet your dancer. We are very concerned with each child's safety and this process will ensure each child is connected with a parent safely and efficiently. Parent volunteers, dance leaders and instructors will stay on stage with each class to ensure that things move as quickly and as smoothly as possible.

Emergency Phone Number

If a dancer is ill and/or you should need to reach us on recital day, please call 847.640.1000 and ask the front desk staff to contact Amy Hubert by cell phone with your name and phone number and tell them that it is an emergency. Please do not leave a voicemail. We will call you back as soon as possible. Hopefully everyone will be healthy, but in the event that a dancer is too sick to perform, we really appreciate knowing in advance so we can prepare her classmates.

Flowers Available at Forest View

It is a tradition in the theater to present flowers to the dancers after a successful performance. For your convenience, floral arrangements will be provided for purchase on recital day so families can purchase flowers at the theater.
